





Minutes of Meeting: Essential Veterinary Drug Program Coordination Meeting & National Veterinary Medicines Committee (NVMC) Meeting

Date: 13 to 14 of February 2025

Venue: Lhazey Suits, Gelephu

# A) Essential Veterinary Drug Program (EVDP) Coordination Meeting

**1. Opening Address:** The Program Director (PD) delivered the opening address, welcoming the participants and highlighting the key agenda points for discussion. He encouraged active participation, urging attendees to voice any issues or concerns regarding veterinary drug management. He also emphasized the importance of collaborative decision-making in ensuring an efficient veterinary drug supply system.

## 2. Keynote address

The meeting was chaired by the Chief, AHD and her keynote address began by conveying the regards and wishes from the Director, DoL. She emphasized the roles of EVDP and SOPs for the welfare of the animals and towards food security. She added that the quality and efficiency are very important in the delivery of veterinary services towards aligning with the 13th FYP target of commercialization building resilience in livestock production.

# 3. Discussion on issues and way forward

Additionally, issues such as under- or oversupply and the provision of drugs nearing expiry were also noted. Many new recruits struggle to use the Veterinary Information System (VIS) effectively, which can impact the efficiency and accuracy of their work. To address this, it is essential to provide structured training for new recruits, ensuring they gain the necessary skills and confidence in using the system. This training should be conducted by their respective Veterinary Officers (VOs) and Regional Heads, who can offer hands-on guidance and practical insights. 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# B) 14th NVMC Meeting Chaired by Chief, AHD

1. Members & Co-opt Members of NVMC

The committee structure was reviewed, listing the **permanent members, including the Chief of the Animal Health Division, the Program Director of the National Centre for Animal Health, and the Head of the National Veterinary Hospital.** The chairmanship will be carried out among the three on rotational basis. Additionally, co-opt members include RD, RVOs, VOs and In-charges/representatives from Central Farms, BFDA, NCA and Wildlife. It was decided that members will be listed by designation or agency rather than by individual names to ensure consistency in representation. Action: NVMC Secretariat, NVMC members

#### 2. Endorsement of Documents

Several key documents were presented with necessary revisions and updates for endorsement as follows:

- a. Standard Treatment Guidelines (STG),
- b. Antibiotic Guidelines,
- c. Drug Formulary,

SAMe (Antioxidant)

Ketorolac

- d. Essential Veterinary Drug List (EVDL).
- e. EVDP strategy & SOPs
- f. Medicine Costing (To continue working as required data were not available)

The NVMC, in principle, endorsed the updated version of these documents and directed the team leaders of the working group to finalize the comments and suggestion provided and submit to the DVEU, NCAH within 15 days, i.e., on the 27th of February 2024. Action: Team leaders of group

#### 4. Additions and Removals in EVDL

The EVDL was also update with deletion and addition of certain drugs as below:

The addition, deletion should be recorded with providing justifications, ensuring that necessary changes align with current requirements. This is in view of some drugs removed from the list in previous edition gets added again hence, at such times, it could be referred easily. Action: Team Leaders & NVMC secretariat

#### 4. Specifications on Herbal Products

The Bhutan Food and Drug Authority (BFDA) stressed the requirement of product content /specifications especially herbals in the EVDL of which are currently missing. Since specifications are important for quality control and monitoring purposes, each drugs should have specifications. Action: Team Leaders

#### 5. Renaming of EVD Programme

Currently the management includes beyond the essential veterinary medicines like vaccines, consumables & equipment. Hence, to reflect a broader scope of management of the items, the *Essential Veterinary Drug Programme* has been renamed as Essential Veterinary Supply System (EVSS) to be managed by DVEU under the National Centre of Animal Health. Action: DOL. NCAH

#### 6. Endorsement and Compliance of SOPs

For efficient management of EVSS, certain new Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs) developed were endorsed for strict compliance, v.i.z. controlled drugs, pharmacovigilance, Adverse Drug Reactions (ADR), and Adverse Events Following Immunization (AEFI). Action: DOL. NCAH, NVH, RLDC, RVH & EC, DVHs, RNRECs, Central agencies

#### 7. Online Reporting for ADR & AEFI

To streamline the monitoring of drug safety, all centres are now required to report adverse drug reactions (ADR) and adverse events following immunization (AEFI) online. This measure aims to enhance the fast tracking and management of adverse reactions veterinary drug-related issues. Action: NCAH, NVH, RLDC, RVH & EC, DVHs, RNRECs, Central agencies

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#### 8. Reporting Frequency for Veterinary medicine usage

A proposal was raised to modify the reporting system from quarterly to bi-annual. However, after thorough discussion, the Chair clarified that the existing **quarterly schedule will be maintained** to ensure more accurate data collection and better tracking of medicine usage as an interim measure till G2C, LIMS, VIS integrated software is completed and rolled out. Action: NCAH, NVH, RLDC, RVH & EC, DVHs, RNRECs, Central agencies

#### 9. Medicine indent for non-departmental organization

As experienced, the non-indented distribution of medicines especially by the non-departmental organizations like, DOFPs & CNR lead to drug shortages. Hence, it was agreed that the annual indent by these organizations to be submitted on time. Action: DoFPs, CNR
